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The Code and why it matters

The Code is a community of organisations committed to making engineering careers accessible for this generation of young people. We do this through four pledges that inspire young people in their experience of STEM, that reach the under-represented groups, that commit to supporting each other to do that.

As such, EngineeringUK has been chosen to manage and deliver The Code and its community, and has the responsibility to drive, co-ordinate and develop The Code.

The Advisory Board

The Code's Advisory Board, which is a partnership of senior representatives, is tasked with considering and deciding how best the UK can increase the diversity and number of young people going into engineering through delivery of The Code.

Thinking Group

An informal Thinking Group, made up of representatives from a mix of organisations that have a collective passion and insight into delivering The Code, also exists to provide EngineeringUK with regular insight to facilitate delivery.
